What are young citizens?

A Young Citizen is anyone aged 14+ who has completed a project that makes their community safer.

We believe that change comes from within the community. Each one of us has the responsibility and the ability to help bring about the changes we want to see. What can you do in your community to make it safer?

How do I become a young citizen?

What is it in your community that makes young people feel unsafe? Pick any issue of safety in your local area and put together a plan for how to address it. Once you've run a project or event or raised awareness or written a letter, or whatever your solution is, send us through some photos or other evidence, explain what you did and how it made your community safer.

We'll send you a certificate, some ideas on how to keep the project going, and we'll connect you with other people who have run similar projects in their local areas so that you can learn and improve what you're doing.

Once you become a Young Citizen, the charity will provide regular opportunities to get involved in fundraising, volunteering and campaigns across the charity, and access to more resources and networks.
